

I speak this to your shame." 1 Corinthians 15:34

"You mean I slept through the party?" my daughter asked, lower lip quivering.

"Yes, there you lay across your bed in your costume. I couldn't wake you for anything." I laughed.

"But, I asked you to wake me up in time." She said with tears spilling over the rims of her eyes.

"I shook you and made noise, but you wouldn't budge." My daughter who was immune deficient and required extra sleep had gone to an overnight gathering at church and came home joyfully exhausted. She dressed for the birthday party then, fell into a very deep sleep. Her body just wouldn't awaken until she was rested. The same thing happened as an adult when she stayed up all night on "Christmas Eve-eve" one year when her children were young. Have we all been sleeping in another more subtle way? Do we need to wake up? A new urgency creeps in with this new year. In these last days, we need to wake up to the fact that the birth pangs of end times are speeding up. We were placed by God right here, right now, for God's special purposes. Jesus said in Matthew 24, "No one knows the day or the hour" when Jesus returns. Every day is closer to the last day. Every day is closer to our personal last day, too. Let's determine to make the most of every opportunity now. A world full of people need the Lord. Just as the virgins awaiting the bridegroom needed oil in their lamps, we, too must shine.

I believe the oil in the lamps in that Matthew 24 parable represent our prayers. How else could we awaken and refuel except by prayer? The world is darker than ever. We have increasing instances of wars and rumors of war, nations rising against nations, and offenses and violence on the rise. Famine, pestilence, and disasters are ever increasing. The light from our prayers must illuminate the darkness.

How do we pray? The Lord's prayer, prayed back to God is a good place to start. Here's an example:

How grateful we are to be in Your presence. We are astounded that You care so much that You sent Jesus to save us.
